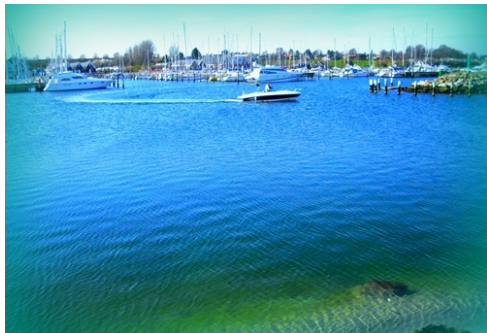

THE CITY



Aarhus was founded by the Vikings some 1300 years ago and has been an important trading city ever since. However, it was not until the 1900's that Aarhus really started growing and soon became Denmark's second largest city after the capital of Copenhagen.

Dubbed the cultural capital of Denmark, Aarhus has been on the forefront of defining Danish art and culture for years, which is also shown in the city's architecture and in the up-and-coming designer shops across Aarhus.

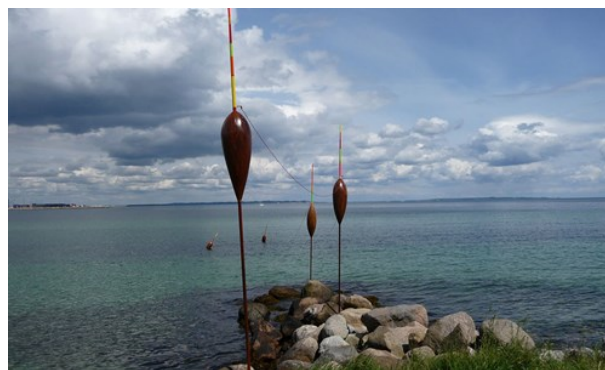

Aarhus Airport

Aarhus Airport is located 45 kilometres north of Aarhus, and a regular bus service takes passengers from the airport to Aarhus bus station in approximately 50 minutes. The bus schedule is according to flight times and you can buy your ticket on the bus. Taxis can also be

found outside the main entrance. Cars rental companies are represented at the airport, but pre-booking is advisable.

Public Transport

Aarhus city centre is compact and easy to cover by foot. For longer trips, the city's bus network is extensive. Tickets can be purchased at the machine in the rear of the bus and last for two hours.
