Time zones

There are three time zones in Australia: Eastern Standard Time (EST), which includes New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory. Central Standard Time (CST), which includes South Australia and the Northern Territory. And Western Standard Time (WST) – Western Australia. CST is half an hour behind EST, while WST is two hours behind EST.

During Your Flight

Virgin Blue's

A la Cart' menu provides a wide variety of snack-foods, meals, alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages



for purchase on all flights. Purchase can be made by cash (AUD on Virgin Blue domestic flights, AUD and NZD on Pacific Blue flights) or credit card (minimum purchase \$5AUD/NZD. Due to licensing restrictions, only alcohol purchased from our in-flight menu may be consumed in-flight only. Any alcohol brought on board our aircraft must remain unopened.

Baggage Limits

To make it easy, all Virgin Blue, Pacific Blue and Polynesian Blue flights have the same travel allowance as follows:

Corporate Plus / Premium Economy

Each Guest occupying a seat (Adult or Child), is permitted to check-in baggage weighing a total of 32 kg, free of charge. Infants do not receive a free baggage allowance.

Flexible Fares

All flexible fares have 23kg baggage included in fare.

Go! Fares or Blue Saver

No free checked baggage allowance. \$8 fee per sector for up to 23kg of checked baggage if pre-purchased at time of booking. Please note Gold and Silver Velocity Members are exempt.

Carry on baggage

One piece not exceeding dimensions of 23 cm in depth, 34 cm in height and 48 cm in length. (total linear dimensions equal to 105cm). In addition, Guests may carry one suit pack or garment bag, non rigid/unfolded not exceeding 11cm in depth x 60cm in width x 114cm in length (total linear dimensions equal to 185cm) or another small bag or briefcase.
