Only three decades ago, Byron Bay was a small sleepy enclave unaware of the hustle and bustle it would later see. Nowadays, the local authorities even have to close off the city for its New Year's celebrations each year, because so many people flock into town. Byron Bay has that small town charm mixed with a cosmopolitan – yet alternative – lifestyle that attracts mainly young people from all over the world. There are no high-rise hotels here but plenty of kilometres of unbroken sandy beaches and heaps of great surf waves to catch. Furthermore, Byron Bay is surrounded by an abundance of pristine nature and wildlife. Due to its location as Australia's most eastern point, the majestic humpback whales pass by twice a year on their travels. You'll never be short for a local market here and all through the year annual festivals take place. This is another attracting factor to lovely Byron Bay - home to more surf schools, yoga studios, funky shops, top restaurants and organic food outlets than you could ever tire of, where most travellers find themselves staying much longer than they had originally planned.

Whale Watching

From May to July grandiose humpback whales pass Byron Bay on their journey to calving and breeding grounds further north. In September and October they come past Byron Bay again when they migrate back to the Antarctic with their youngsters. Several companies organise boat trips out to sea to watch the whales.

Whale Watching Byron Bay is the only whale watching tour operator departing directly from Byron Bay. They conduct small and intimate tours with a maximum of 12 people per vessel.

Byron Bay has a wealth of alternative and arts & craft shops. Jonson Street is lined with shops selling everything from beach clothes to surfing gear but also crystals and locally made crafts, such as jewellery. This area is mainly famous for the various markets around at the weekends where Byron Bay's alternative community becomes even more visible. Musicians sometime even play at the different markets so watch out for event notices in the local newspapers. Local produce and arts & crafts are on display at the Byron Bay Market on Butler Street every first Sunday of the month. There is also an Arts Factory on Skinners Shoot Road from Tuesdays to Sundays while the Byron Craft Market is held there every Saturday. The Epicentre on Border Street also houses the work of several local artists and craft people. Beyond Byron Bay, you can find The Channon and Murwillumbah markets on every second Sunday of the month while Lismore, Pottsville and the Uki markets are on every third Sunday. Visit the Arts and Industry Estate, just off Ewingsdale Road (about 2 km west of Byron Bay). The Arts and Industry Estate Guide (available at the Byron Bay Tourist Office, near the railway station) lists a huge range of creative enterprises located in this compact precinct. All the art and craft galleries, as well as a number of clothing and footwear warehouses in the Estate, offer their products at prices up to 50% less than you will pay in Byron's pricey Jonson and Lawson Streets.

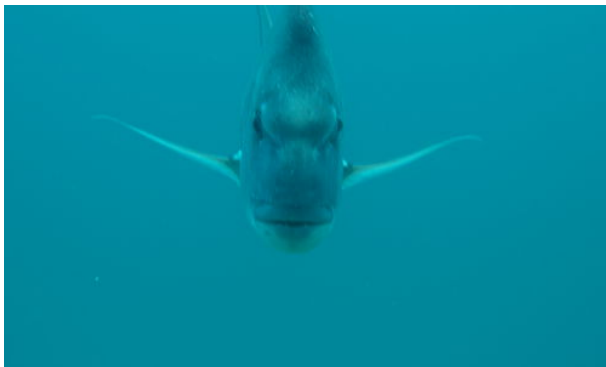
