Often called the 21st arrondissement of Paris, Deauville has been the go-to destination for the upper crust of French society for decades. Today it is a spectacular seaside resort town sporting grand promenades, glamorous casinos, a pair of thoroughbred horse racetracks and plenty of chic visitors. Filled with classic bistros, smart restaurants, expensive villas and pricey fashion boutiques – not to mention a stunning beach and boardwalk – this meeting place of the rich and famous is one of the most glamorous beach resorts in France.

THE CITY

Deauville is a haven for trend-watchers and lovers of the finer things in life – beaches, casinos, horse racing and couture shopping. Its glamorous, old world villas, manors and hotels host many cultural events and festivals throughout the year, most notably a star-studded film festival in September that gives Cannes a run for its money. The town is centred around the Promenade des Planches, a 643m-long wooden boardwalk that fronts the town's main beach, lined with wooden cabins and a gaggle of brightly coloured parasols. Deauville's fashionable avenues and plazas – Ruedes Villas and Place Morny among them – are veritable Meccas for boutique shopping. And in the centre are the town's legendary racetracks, used for equestrian races throughout the year. Summer is peak season for Deauville, but during the winter, life slows down and much of the action moves to neighbouring Trouville, a few minutes' walk east, where you'll find a busy fishing port, lively Sunday market and quiet, winding streets full of sublime French charm.

Deauville Beach

Some visitors might find the water along Deauville's 1400m-long beach a bit too cold to swim in – even during the summer. Many choose to rent one of the colourful umbrellas and keep to the sands, where celebrity spotting is the most popular activity. The beach has all the amenities and facilities you could want: seaside tennis, recreation clubs for children and teens, a swimming pool, thalasso spa and a water sports centre where you can rent boats and boards.

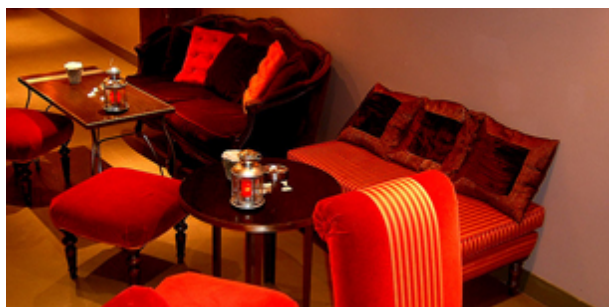

Deauville has no shortage of places to down a pint, linger on a glass of Chardonnay or sip on a pricey cocktail. Be sure also to try out neighbouring Trouville, whose enjoyable drinking establishments may be less posh – but are no less French. Given the clientele that comes to sojourn in Deauville, it is little surprise that the town has a superb, non-stop nightlife with dozens of chic and fashionable clubs and music venues. You'll be able to find more relaxed places too. Many clubs open at 10pm and don't close their doors until well past 5am.

Deauville rivals Paris for ultra-chic designer shopping, featuring some of the fashion world's most well-known (and highly-priced) brands. For haute couture and the latest clothing and accessories, make a beeline for the streets connecting place de Casino with place Morny, where you'll find several dozen small boutiques and shops. Prices won't be any cheaper than elsewhere, of course, but there are few more glamorous places to shop than Deauville and chances are you'll be rubbing shoulders with some famous shopaholics. The most well known shops include luxury names like Louis Vuitton, Hermès, Cartier, Sonia Rykiel and Dior – there's a reason some joke that the town's name should be "Doughville"! In terms of other shopping, Deauville has two other main streets to explore: rue Desiré-le-Hoc and rue Eugène Colas, where a number of small boutiques sell clothing, jewellery and various local French products. Also on Eugène Colas is Printemps, France's most famous department store. The nearby av de la République has places selling antiques, knick-knacks and French delicacies. Place Morny holds a farmers' market every Tuesday and Friday from 9am to 1pm, where rural French vendors

sell homemade products like cheese, bread and wines.

Deauville is small enough that you can easily walk around town, though bicycles, roller skates and scooters can easily be rented at Cycle Lucas, 92 av de la République. There is also a small tourist train which departs the town hall for trips around town (Easter-Sept only 5.50€). Deauville is connected to nearby Trouville by two bus services, as well as by a small 5-minute ferry (summer only) which leaves from the Quai des Yachts in Deauville – though it only takes about 15 minutes to walk.
