SHOPPING



Helsinki features several versatile department stores, Stockmann being the biggest in the entire Nordic region in terms of both space and turnover. The main shopping streets are Aleksanterinkatu, Mannerheimintie, and Pohjois- and Eteläesplanadi. Here, even the occasional visitor can enjoy a variety of fashion and design shops. The clear, uncluttered and minimalist style characterises the Finnish design. The streets around the Esplanade Park also feature several famous Finnish brands. Shoppers who appreciate the highest quality make their way to the Kämp Gallery on the Pohjoisesplanadi. Those in search of fashion will not want to miss the shops along Fredrikinkatu.

At the several market squares of Helsinki, vendors set up their stalls every morning and people wander around, browsing and buying. The most famous is the Market Square (Kauppatori) at the South Harbour. Located also at the harbour the Old Market Hall is the oldest covered market in Finland. Every December, the Senate Square hosts a Christmas market. The Hakaniemi indoor market is a treasure trove for shoppers, its upper floor offering a wide range of textiles, souvenirs and fashion (e.g. a Marimekko shop). The ground floor is devoted to foodstuffs and a delicatessen.
The Hietalahti Square at the western end of Bulevardi Street hosts during the summer time the city's

best-known flea market.

Design District Helsinki

Those interested in design should visit Helsinki's design oriented neighbourhood, the Design District. The area is home to a wide range of designer shops, interior decorating studios, antique dealers, clothing and jewellery boutiques, artist workshops, galleries, museums, restaurants and lots more. The symbolic centre of the area is Dianapuisto Park. From here the Design District stretches into the districts of Kaartinkaupunki, Kamppi, Punavuori and Ullanlinna.

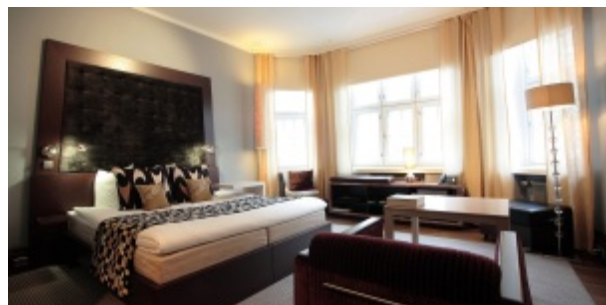

Arriving in Helsinki

By plane - Around 200 international flights a day arrive at Helsinki-Vantaa Airport, which is situated 19 kilometres from the centre of Helsinki and can be reached by car in approximately 25 minutes. Public Transport

With a single ticket you can hop aboard trams, busses, the metro and even the ferry to Suomenlinna – why not to try for instance a sightseeing tour with the 3B/3T tram. Single tickets can be purchased from the driver, from ticket machines or even by sending an SMS text message by mobile phone (requires a Finnish service provider).

Daytickets are available for unlimited use on public transportation for 1-7 days. They can be purchased from ticket machines, from the Tourist Information or from the Helsinki City Transport service point in the Central Railway Station.
