Ibiza is more than just bars and beach life. Take a day to explore the island by bike or car, stroll among the narrow streets of Dalt Vila and pick up a real bargain at the Hippie market. This is a lovely holiday destination!

Cova De Can Marça

Enjoy the breathtaking views of the sea as you descend into the prehistoric and concealed cave system once used by tobacco and liquor smugglers. Stalagmites and stalactites decorate the cave and at the centre there's a 9 meter high water cascade. Tours are every hour from 10.30 until sunset every day all year.

Dalt Vila

The Dalt Vila (old town) Walls is declared a World Heritage site by UNESCO and was built in the 16th century as a defense against attackers. The narrow and cobbled streets are well-preserved and magnificent views await on the top of the castle complex as well as by the Santa María Cathedral - the crown of the Dalt Vila. The outstanding gateway Portal de ses Taules can be found in the north wall. It is definitely worth a visit as it is a small town in itself.

Diving

Warm, clear waters and lots of coastline with rich marine life makes Ibiza an amazing place for divers and snorkelling. Dive sites include cave diving and ship wreck diving.

There are many professional diving schools scattered around on Ibiza's beaches, but they can be quite pricey though.

The enormous market offers a great choice of clothing and jewelry at low prices. If you look closely, you can still spot some of the original hippies who started the market in the 1960s. It's open every Wednesday 10 am-7 pm from May until October.

Exploring The Island
