THE CITY

This pearl of the Mediterranean is a mini continent in its own right. Mallorca's varied scenery has made the island a dream place for filmmakers and advertisers. You can see the variety for yourself through the windshield of your hired car. Within 20 minutes, you can drive from the capital Palma to sensationally beautiful Valldemossa in the mountains to the northwest—the village where the composer Frederic Chopin lived with his sweetheart, the authoress George Sand. Drive another 10 minutes, and you are in the village of Deià, former home of the poet Robert Graves. If you go southeast of Palma, you will find a picturesque fishing idyll and magnificent fjord-like bays near the village of Portopetro, 45 minutes away. A slice of the West Indies in Mallorca—the vast beach of Es Trenc—lies a few miles to the west. Head north, toward Capdepera, and you will be amazed by the mediaeval castle built over a crumbled city wall. Golden sandy beaches are flanked by lofty mountains straight out of "The Fellowship of the Ring." The golf courses gleam, and the sea is its deepest turquoise. Everywhere there are forts, monasteries, beautiful beaches, treasures, myths and legends.

Palma

The fishing nets put out to dry on the quayside glisten brightly in Mediterranean blue. Behind the nets you can catch sight of the stock exchange building La Lonja, dating from 1388. During the Middle Ages, the place where we are now drinking coffee was where most of the Mediterranean area's trade was handled. As early as 123 BC the Romans christened this town with the name Palmeria. Later, the name given to Palma by the Moors—Medina Mayurka—became the name for the whole island.

Casco Antiguo – Old Town

You can hear echoes of previous centuries in the lanes and alleyways of the Old Town. Take a stroll around one of the largest areas of ancient buildings in Europe, cast your eyes over the spruced-up palaces, visit the designer hotels and bars.

Binissalem Wine Village

Try a wine tasting at José Louis Ferrer and the other bodegas. Mallorca's wines are winning more and more prizes. During the Wine Festival in September, Binissalem is just one long table laden with wine and food.

Monastery at Valldemossa

High mountains and deep valleys frame Valldemossa, the village where the island's two first "celebrity tourists" – the composer Frederic Chopin and the authoress George Sand – lived in 1838. At the monastery, all the cells for the monks are in a row, each with its own exit to the garden terrace with blossoming magnolias and a wonderful view over the valley.

Formentor

Dizzying twisting roads and dramatic cliffs, north-west Mallorca is wild and beautiful. People crowd the vantage points along the road, and take photographs with goosebumps on their arms.

Sineu

In Mallorca's centre lies the oldest village of all, Sineu, where the King once lived. Being right at the centre of the island meant there was a chance of getting away if the island was over taken by pirates. For over a thousand years, farmers have been coming here with their cows, bulls, horses, sheep, dogs, asses, mules, ducks, hens and swans to market each Wednesday.

Soller

The inhabitants of Soller lived for centuries hidden in a valley behind a huge row of mountains. It was so hard to climb the mountain chain that people preferred to go to Palma by boat. And if they were on a boat anyway, why not go to France? Soller became tri-lingual—Mallorcan, Spanish and French. In 1911 a tunnel was dug through the mountains, so finally the people of Soller could get in touch with their own island. The wonderful little train is still there today.

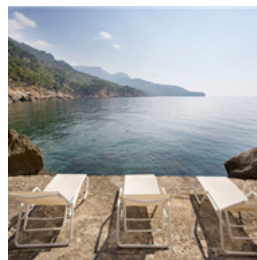

Airport

Bus number 1 runs to and from Palma's airport for around €2 and takes about 30 minutes. A taxi journey to Palma costs around €15 or more and takes 15 minutes. Usually there is a supplement of at least €3 for journeys to the airport.

Public Transport

The bus service on Mallorca is excellent. Within Palma you travel using a credit card that you can buy in tobacconists for €8. The card gives you 10 journeys. Bus number 3 goes all the way from an industrial area via Palma's town centre to the Illetas beach. Public transport buses to Valldemossa and other popular villages leave from the bus station behind Plaza España. The 1911 train to Sóller departs just near the buses, and similar trains to Inca and Manacor.

Taxi

Taxis in Palma are a good and cheap. You can get to and from other places on the island for a reasonable sum of money. A 35-40 minute journey between Palma and Puerto de Sóller costs €35. The price includes the €4 charge for the tunnel.
