Rodez was the historical capital of Rouergue, a former province of France, now the prefecture of the department of Aveyron. It has been an Episcopal city since the 4th century, proud of its beautiful 80-metre tall cathedral with its impressive bell-tower.

This charming town is easy to explore on foot: a romantic walk will take you on a journey through the city's two thousand years of history.

Furthermore, between town and countryside,
Greater Rodez is home to a renowned historical heritage with beautiful sites to visit.




