THE CITY



Visit Varberg

Varberg, a municipality of over 63,000 inhabitants, is situated on the west coast of Sweden. It's where the rugged Bohuslän coast meets the open coast of Halland with its extensive sandy beaches.

Varberg has a complex history and is the most relocated town in the Nordics, having had five different locations. The current layout as a grid-plan town dates back to the 1660s.

Varberg's castle and fortress, initially built in the 13th century on the Wardberg rock, have a significant history. "Ward" means guard, and large fires, known as 'vårdkasar,' were lit here as defensive signals. The fortress has housed many kings and queens over the centuries.

The 19th century saw the development of Varberg as a spa town after a water source was discovered in Apelviken. The buildings from that era, including the Cold Bath House, Warm Bath House, and Societetsparken, still stand and serve their original purposes. Moreover, several hotels with spa departments offer unique experiences ranging from thalassotherapy (seawater spa) to Asian-inspired spa treatments.

Varberg is a popular destination, with tourism being a significant sector of its economy. The town boasts a diverse range of businesses, including food producers, distribution companies, and innovative IT firms.



World Heritage Grimeton Radio Station



The radio station in Grimeton was opened in 1925 for wireless radio links and today represents a unique technological heritage. It

was added to UNESCO's list of world heritage sites in 2004. The facility, along with its six accompanying aerial towers, serves as the sole surviving example of a once-global network of long wave stations.

Getterön Nature Reserve — a Bird Sanctuary



Getterön is a nature reserve that encompasses an area of 3.5 square kilometres, including parts of the Getterön peninsula. It's mainly

popular due to its exceptional bird watching

opportunities, providing hiding spots and observation positions that allow visitors to get up close to the birds without disturbing them.

During spring and autumn, large numbers of species regularly breed or nest here. In addition to the permanent bird residents in Getterön, a large number of temporary guests flock to the area, contributing to a remarkable total of 336 recorded species in the region.



Fishing



In Varberg, there are many beautiful places where you can fish. You can find both popular fishing waters as well as more obscure fishing

spots that will amaze you with their charming landscape.

The harbours and the sandy beaches are suitable places for coastal fishing where flatfish where flatfish are commonly caught. In various locations, such as the peninsulas of Rödskär, Subbe, Getterön, and Norra Näs, you may also find sea trout, salmon, cod, haddock, and pollocks. However, it's important to note that these species are protected, and fishing is restricted to specific months of the year.

Snorkelling



There are different locations to snorkel in Varberg. They extend over sandy bottoms, eelgrass beds, and seaweed-covered rocks.

In most outdoor bath spots there are white buoys located in shallow water while the red ones are placed in deeper water.

The depth can vary depending on the low and high tide, but the maximum depth is about three meters and minimum depth is approximately one meter. Första vik Getterön is one of the most frequented places for snorkelling, but if you're accompanied by children, Tredje vik Getterön is a more suitable option with its shallower and safer waters.

Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. In order to enter the Schengen zone, international, non-Schengen travellers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their trip. Citizens from Schengen countries can travel without a passport, but they must bring with them a valid ID during their stay.


