Like so many of the towns and cities of Egypt, Hurghada, Luxor and Marsa Alam are living history museums. The three cities are positioned as corners of a triangle in the Eastern Desert. Hurghada, a former fishing harbour, stretches 24 kilometres along the waterfront and is the perfect area for water sports. Marsa Alam is found by the Red Sea coast and tourism is just starting to make an impact. The city of Luxor, with its jaw-droppingly beautiful monuments built by the hands of ancient craftsmen, lies 240 kilometres inland on the banks of the River Nile.

HURGHADA

Hurghada has been home to fishing communities for centuries and remained unchanged until the 1990s when tourists discovered this idyllic village. With wide stretches of beaches along the coastline and sea waters that were relatively safe and great for watersports, the city was, and still is, ideal for tourism. Today, it is a busy, sprawling town divided into two main areas, the Old Town Ad-Dahar to the north, and Sigala to the south. Each boasts a wide range of hotels and restaurants catering for all tastes and tourist attractions.

LUXOR

Luxor was the capital of Egypt around 1500-1000 BC and has over the years seen astonishing numbers of palaces and temples built here. Because the structures were built of granite and sandstone, they still remain to this day. Among the “must-sees” are: the Luxor

Temple, which dates to the Amenhotep III and Ramses II periods, the complex of temples known as the Karnak Temples, the Luxor Museum, the Mummification Museum — the first of its kind in the world —, the Funerary Temples and the valleys of the Kings and Queens.

MARSA ALAM

Marsa Alam still has the air of an unspoilt village, which makes it an ideal base for those looking for a quieter break. It is located within a three to four-hour drive of both Luxor and Hurghada.

Tourism has found Marsa Alam basically because of its location on the banks of the Red Sea. Here you can go on boat trips to watch multi-coloured fish, dolphins, turtles and the coral reefs that lie just offshore. The popularity has grown so much in the past years that it now has its own airport and an increasing number of luxury resort-style accommodations.

Karnak



Dating back over 3,000 years, Karnak is a monumental complex of temples, pylons, and chapels. The most significant structure is the Temple of Amun-Ra. The Hypostyle hall, at 16,459 square metres and featuring 134 columns, is still the largest room of any religious building in the world. Besides the main sanctuary, there are several smaller temples and a vast sacred lake.


DINING

Passport/Visa



All visitors to Egypt must obtain a visa from one of the Egyptian diplomatic missions before entering the country or holding an Egypt eVisa. Upon entering, visitors must hold a passport that is valid for, at least, six months from the date of arrival in Egypt.

Hurghada International Airport, situated 5 km southwest of downtown Hurghada, offers convenient transportation options to and from the city.
