### Passport/Visa



Citizens of the Schengen countries, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan and the Kingdom of Brunei can visit the United States for up to 90 days without applying for a visa (as well as citizens of Andorra, Lichtenstein, Monaco and San Marino). Citizens

of these countries must obtain an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before traveling. All other travelers must obtain a visa before visiting the United States. International travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the country.

### Best Time To Visit



The best time to visit Atlanta is during the spring (March-May) when the weather is mild, hotel prices are somewhat lower and the city hosts a few outdoor concerts and events, including the Atlanta Jazz Festival and the Atlanta Dogwood Festival.

Summers in Atlanta are known for being fairly hot and humid, hotel prices are high, and the city becomes crowded with tourists, but that's when most festivals take place, such as the Atlanta Food & Wine Festival and the Coca-Cola Summer Film Festival. ### Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL)



Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), located about 16 kilometers south of downtown Atlanta, is the busiest airport in the world, serving over 100 million passengers annually. As a major hub for domestic and international travel, ATL offers a wide range of

amenities and efficient transportation options to and from the city. The airport is well-connected by MARTA, Atlanta's rapid transit system, which provides a direct rail link from the Domestic Terminal to downtown in approximately 15-20 minutes.

Travelers can also reach the city via taxis, ride-sharing services, or rental cars. Taxis and ride-shares are available at designated pickup areas, while car rental services are accessible via the SkyTrain, which connects passengers to the Rental Car Center in just a few minutes.

## Taxi

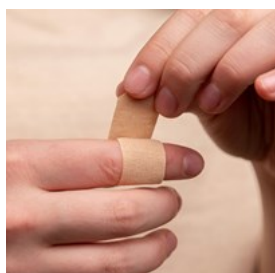


While taxis are available in Atlanta, they are not as ubiquitous as in some other major cities.

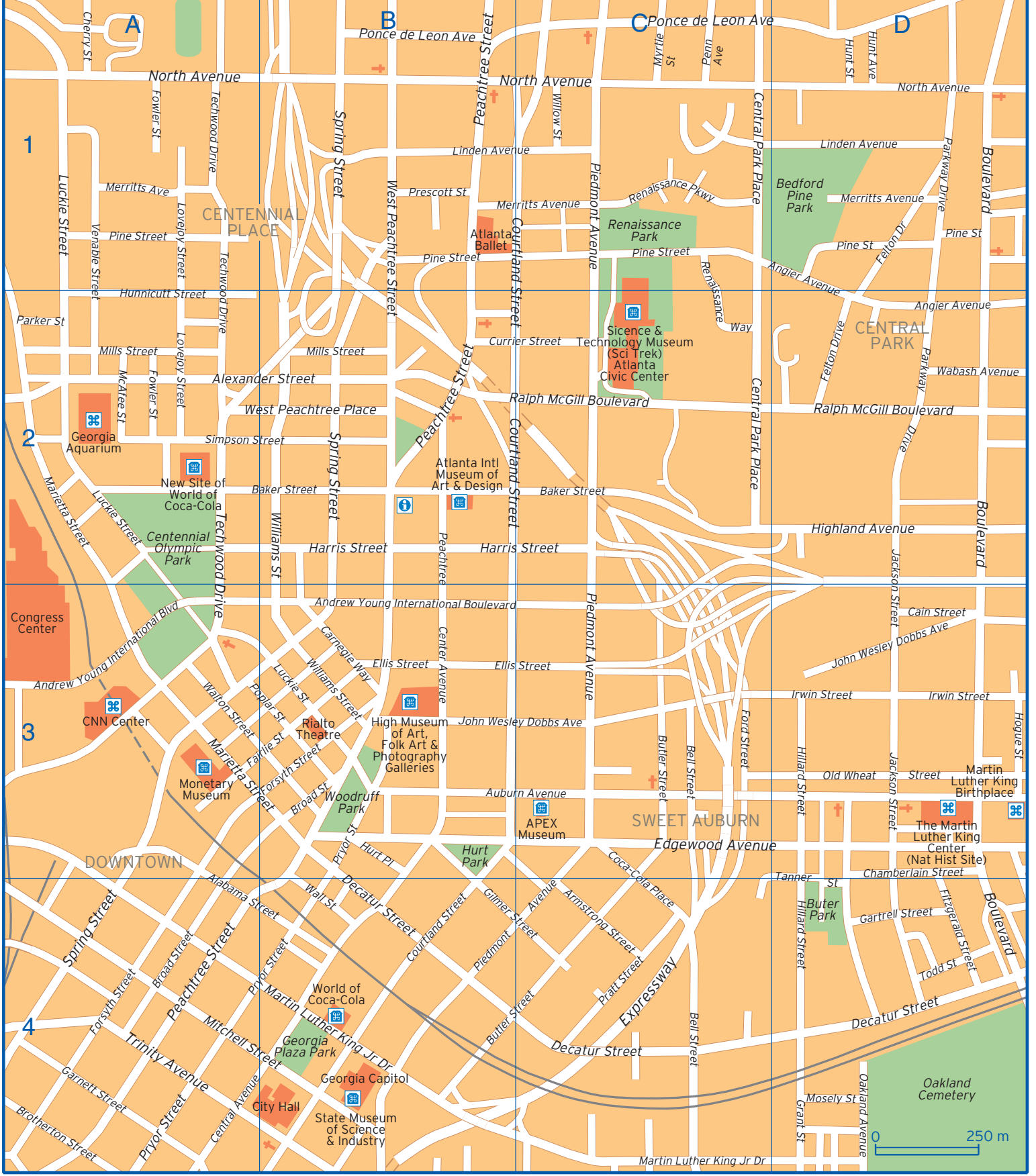
