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THE CITY

Offering premier performances without the abundance of casinos, Branson holds its own as one of America's leading entertainment destinations. Its value is substantially increased by the backdrop of the Ozark Mountains and a series of lakes and rivers.

Settled in 1882 by postmaster and store operator Reuben Branson, the township was incorporated around the construction of the Powersite Dam on the White River. The area's identity as a tourist destination began to form in 1894 when the Marble Cave was bought by entrepreneur William Henry Lynch. Visitors were charged a fee for tours of the cave; decades later it would be purchased by a couple and renamed the Marvel Cave, becoming retrofitted with electricity and staircases to become more visitor-friendly.

In 1907, the popular novel "The Shepherd of the Hills" was published by Harold Bell Wright, which reinvigorated national interest in the grandeur of the Ozarks. The 1950s and 1960s would see Branson sprout a variety of attraction mainstays, including Silver Dollar City, the Old Mill Theater, Red Foley's "Ozark Jubilee," and the Table Rock Dam. But perhaps the most pivotal moment in Branson's history came in 1991, when "60 Minutes" dubbed Branson the

"live music capital of the entire universe."

The phenomenal growth in the theater, accommodation, dining, retail, real estate, and service industries was spurred, bringing a profusion of tourists, business developers, performers, and even new residents into Branson. Resorts and golf clubs bloomed on the lakefronts of Table Rock Lake and Lake Taneycomo, while Branson Landing became a hub of dining and shopping attractions along its strip.

Branson Scenic Railway



The Branson Scenic Railway offers a 40-mile round trip through the Ozark Mountains, showcasing breathtaking views of rugged

landscapes, historic tunnels, and bridges.

Departing from Branson's restored 1905 depot,

the journey lasts about two hours, with narration providing insights into the region's history and the railway's legacy. Passengers can choose seating in restored vintage cars from the 1940s and 1950s, including dome cars for panoramic views.

The experience includes a concession car, and from April through November, a luxurious four-course dinner train enhances select Saturday evenings. Reservations are highly recommended for special events like the dinner train.

Table Rock Lake



Nestled amidst the Ozark Mountains is Table Rock Lake, a Mecca for aquatic enthusiasts and fishermen. Swimming, wakeboarding, skiing, tubing, racing, and diving can all be done in the lake, while hikers will find the endless trails and wildlife alluring. Underneath Table Rock is the massive Missouri cave system—which is also open for exploration. Fishermen will be interested to know the record largemouth bass, catfish, crappie, and other fish that reside at the lake. And all of Branson's attractions lie just beyond the hills.

Silver Dollar City



Silver Dollar City is a cornerstone of Branson's entertainment scene, offering a blend of thrills, family fun, and Ozark charm. With over 30 rides, including adrenaline-pumping roller coasters and 10 family-friendly attractions, there's something for everyone. The park also hosts 40 live shows daily, showcasing music, comedy, and theater.

Beyond the rides and performances, Silver Dollar City is home to more than 100 working craftsmen, making it a unique destination for shopping and learning about traditional crafts like glassblowing, blacksmithing, and pottery. Dining options abound, with restaurants and concessions serving everything from hearty Ozark favorites to classic theme park treats.

The park's calendar is packed with six world-class festivals, including Bluegrass & BBQ, Moonlight Madness, and the Southern Gospel Picnic. Seasonal highlights like the National Harvest Festival and Christmas celebrations make every visit special.

Lake Taneycomo

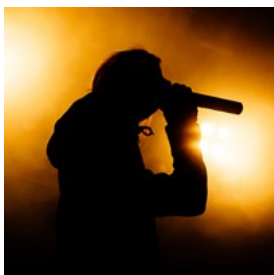


Lake Taneycomo is accessed by way of Downtown Branson, south of Highway 76 in Hollister. The lake is clear and coldwater,

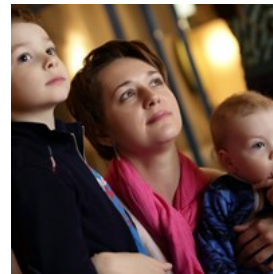

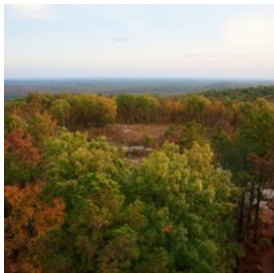
Downtown Branson

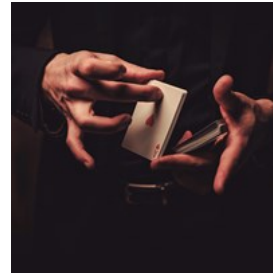
Lakeside Forest Wilderness Area

Best Time to Visit



The best time to visit Branson, Missouri, is during the spring (April to May) or fall (September to October) when the weather is

pleasant, with mild temperatures and fewer crowds. Fall brings breathtaking foliage and popular events like the Autumn Daze Festival. Passport/Visa



Citizens of Schengen Area countries, along with Andorra, Australia, Brunei, Canada, Ireland, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino,

Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom, can visit the United States for up to 90 days without needing a visa, provided they obtain an approved ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before their trip. All other travelers must secure a visa before visiting the U.S.

In addition, international travelers must ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. For the most current information and any updates on entry requirements, it is advisable to consult the U.S. Department of State website or contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate before traveling.

With the exception of Sparky, the free trolley service available in Downtown Branson, there is no public transportation. Sparky

operates year-round, connecting key areas such as Historic Downtown, Branson Landing, and the Convention Center through a series of convenient stops on two routes. This service is especially beneficial for visitors exploring downtown attractions. However, for areas beyond the trolley's reach, renting a car is highly recommended. While walking can be an option,

Branson's hilly terrain, due to its location in the Ozark Mountains, may pose challenges for some travelers.

In Branson, Missouri, taxis are available but not as prevalent as in larger cities. Companies like Branson Taxi & Concierge Services and

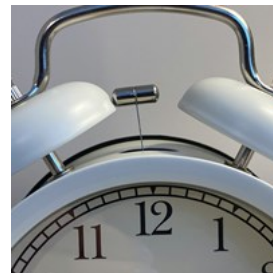

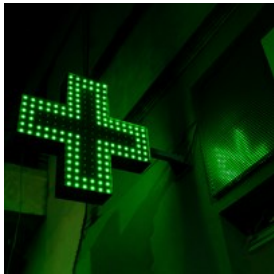
