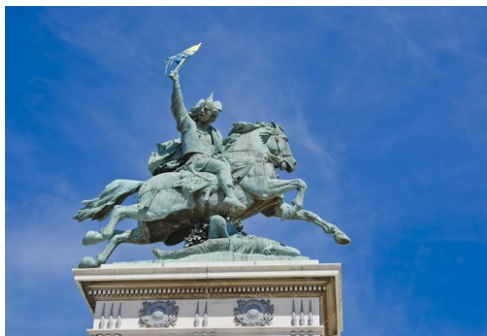

A historical and cultural hub, Clermont-Ferrand houses architectural beauties and glorious cathedrals with a clear Gothic accent. Nestled at the foot of a chain of volcanoes, this ancient city is the capital of "Massif Central", the rural and mountainous Auvergne region. The city is the gateway to the Natural Volcano Park, which shifts from mountains to valleys, providing breathtaking views over unspoiled landscapes.

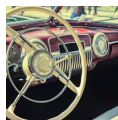

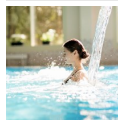

THE CITY

Clermont-Ferrand ranks among the oldest cities of France. Renowned for its thermal springs, it acquired great importance under the Roman emperors and became an Episcopal city ruled by its bishop in the Middle Ages. The counts of Auvergne decided to found the city of Montferrand just next to Clermont to counteract the power of the clergy. The two cities were eventually forced to join in 1630 by a royal edict.

Nowadays, the old city centres are still separated. The city has kept this unique historical identity embarking onto a huge transformation program that is aimed to shape its new image as a European metropolis.

The city's major sights and historical beauties are connected by several walking paths that run through the two ancient town centres of Clermont and Montferrand. The whole area is home to architectural treasures, museums, castles and some of France's richest Roman heritage.

The region where the city lies is a wonderful site for outdoor activities and adventures, providing travellers with some incomparable walking-trails that twist and turn around the imposing Puy De Dôme volcano.

Cathedral of Our Lady of the Assumption



It took over 500 years, from the 13th century to the 19th century, to build this Cathedral with volcanic stones. Inside you can find unique stained-glass windows and wall paintings, and if you walk up the Bayette tower you will get the best panoramic view of the area.

A vibrant gathering point, Place de Jaude is set in the middle of the city.

The square features an imposing statue of Vercingetorix, the Gaul

hero who stopped Julius Caesar, sitting imperiously on a horse and holding a glaive, and is home to some of the most iconic monuments of Clermont-Ferrand, such as the Opera Theatre.

Place de la Victoire



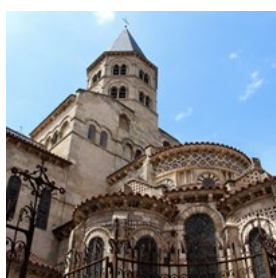
The second largest square of Clermont-Ferrand, just after the one of Jaude, Place de la Victoire is located in the heart of the

historic centre of the city. Besides the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Assumption, it is surrounded by notable buildings, including the former home of the famous philosopher Blaise Pascal. In the centre stands the statue of Urban II, the pope at the origin of the First Crusade. Today, it is a dynamic gathering place thanks to its several bars and restaurants.

Best Time to Visit



When going to Clermont-Ferrand, the best time to visit is during the summer, between June and September. The hottest months are July

and August, with temperatures reaching up to over 30°C. But because of its geographical location in the centre of France and in an old volcanic crater, there is often little wind and the air can therefore quickly become stifling. The lakes around the city, such as Lac Pavin and Lac Chambon, are a great area to get fresh air. If you prefer more moderate temperatures, April to June are ideal, even if the weather conditions may be changeable. In winter, temperatures can be very low, can even drop below 0°C, but the snowfall is perfect for a ski session at one of the resorts in nearby towns like Super Besse and MontDore.

A nominee for the European Capital of Culture title in 2028, Clermont-Ferrand hosts many cultural events throughout the year. In February, the International Short Film Festival is held, which presents and rewards the works of filmmakers from around the world. In June, the

Europavox music festival takes place with a programme made up of French and international artists. If you are a rugby fan, try to attend a match of the ASM team at Marcel Michelin Stadium for a unique experience.

Passport / Visa



France can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens of most European countries, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea,

Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend contacting the embassy or consulate in your country. International (non-Schengen) travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the Schengen zone. Citizens of Schengen countries can travel without a passport, but must have a valid ID with them during their stay.

Clermont-Ferrand Auvergne Airport (CFE)



Clermont-Ferrand Auvergne Airport is located approximately 6-7 km east of Clermont-Ferrand's city centre, making it easily

accessible in around 10-15 minutes by car. Travellers can use public transport: T2C bus line 20 stops a short walk from the terminal and connects to the city centre in roughly 30-40 minutes. Alternatively, the Gare d'Aulnat-Aéroport railway station, just five

minutes on foot from the terminal, offers SNCF TER trains that reach the centre in about 10 minutes.

Taxis are available at the terminal and typically take 10-15 minutes to reach central Clermont-Ferrand. Ride-hailing services such as Uber and Bolt also operate at this airport.

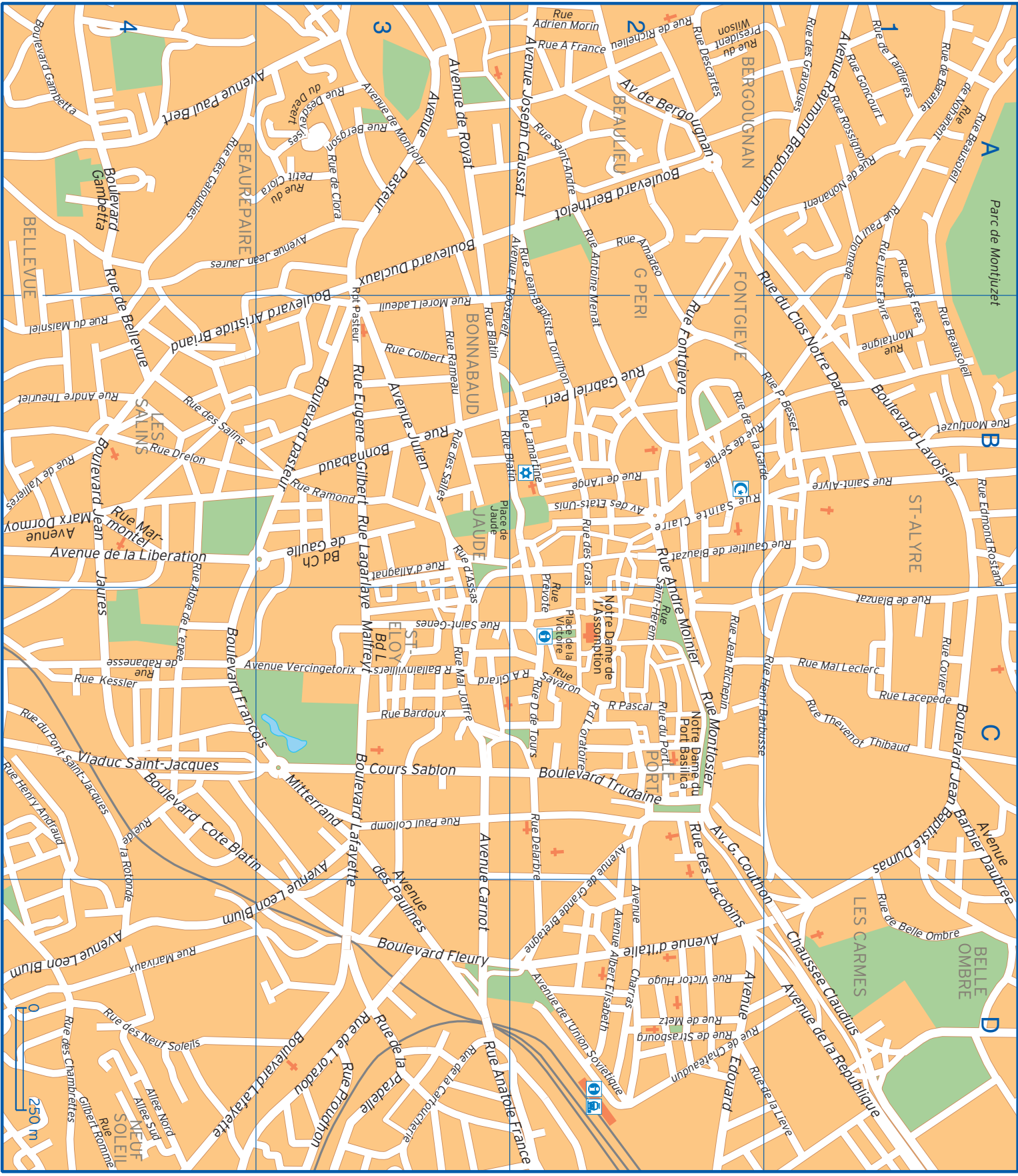
