## COSTA MAYA

Costa Maya is an emerging tourist region in the state of Quintana Roo, washed by the Caribbean Sea less than 100 miles away from Mexico's border with Belize. The area includes a shore of 60 miles stretching from Sian Ka'an in the north to Xcalak in the south.

The history of Costa Maya dates back to ancient times, when the area was inhabited by the Maya and other Native American civilizations. The Maya built a series of city-states in the region, including the sites of Chacchoben, Kohunlich, and Dzibanche, and conducted flourishing maritime trade across the Yucatán peninsula. From the 16th century onwards, the region saw a series of clashes involving Spanish colonizers and English pirates, which lasted until the advent of Mexican independence.

The area has not been spared by natural disasters either. Xcalak ceased to exist as a major port after Hurricane Janet in 1955, and Mahahual too was hit in the years of 2007 and 2012. These were a setback for the development the region had seen in previous decades, but today Costa Maya is on an upswing again and is seeing more and more visitors every year.

Costa Maya is an up and coming tourist region that has something to offer to all age groups. Lesser-known Maya ruins such as Chacchoben and Kohunlich are sure to amaze with their amazing history and architecture, as well as natural wonders like Banco Chinchorro. If some quiet time by the beach is what you are after, the Malecón, 'boardwalk,' in Mahahual will likely cater to all your needs.

### Maya Ruins of Chacchoben



A favorite daytrip destination from Costa Maya, the Chacchoben Maya ruins are located nearby a city of the same name, only 50 minutes

away from the cruise port. This fascinating landmark is estimated to have been inhabited since as early as 1000 BC, and after a fairly late discovery in the 1940s, it still contains several unexcavated areas. Visitors can pick from a range of tour operators to be guided through the site, and as a bonus can admire the remarkable flora of what is called the 'Region of the Lakes.'

### Banco Chinchorro

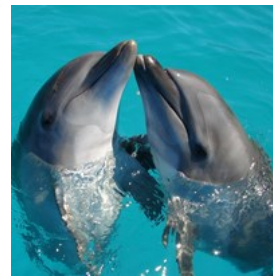


Not only does Costa Maya have excellent conditions for diving and snorkeling, it also boasts a true rarity: Banco Chinchorro Biosphere Reserve is a coral reef located around 18 miles off the coast

of Mahahual. As part of the Mesoamerican Reef, the second largest coral reef system in the world, it is home to a diverse array of marine life as well as dozens of sunken ships, some of which date back to the 16th century. You can find a multitude of dive centers along Mahahual's boardwalk, Malecón.

### Kohunlich



Under the shelter of lush rainforest, the archeological site of Kohunlich is an outstanding example of Maya architecture.

Palaces, citadels, temples, such as the top attraction Temple of the Masks, and other elaborate structures are scattered over an area of more than 20 acres, with most landmarks dating back to as early as 250 to 600 AD. Chetumal is a common starting point to visit Kohunlich, but tours are available at the Costa

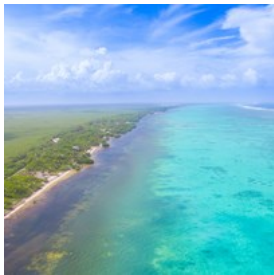
Maya Cruise Port as well. If you are in the area, don't miss out on the opportunity to visit Dzibanche, another outstanding Maya landmark around 20 miles away from Kohunlich.

With a length of 30 miles, Lake Bacalar, also known as 'Laguna Bacalar,' is the largest lake of the Yucatán peninsula. Also called 'The Lake of Seven

Colors', it is a spectacular landmark for its clear azure water, fed by groundwater emerging from 'cenotes,' or natural sinkholes. The landmark is within a 60-mile distance from Mahahual. There are restaurants near the shore, and sports activities such as kayaking and windsurfing are

available, too.

There is no airport within reasonable distance to Costa Maya. The nearest airport, Chetumal International Airport, is around 90 miles from Mahahual, but car rental options are available there, and road conditions are also considered good.

Chetumal International Airport is relatively small and serves a limited number of airlines, including Volaris, Viva Aerobus, AeroMexico, and

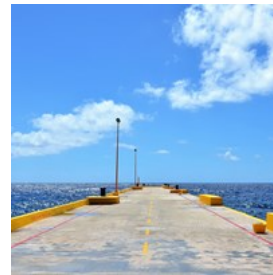
American Airlines. While most flights connect to destinations within Mexico, a few routes extend to select locations in the United States.

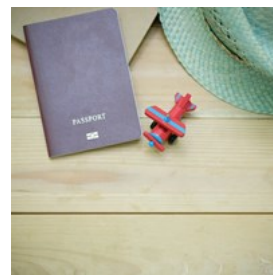

### Passport & Visa



Visa exemption applies to citizens of all EU countries, most countries in the Americas, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, and

more. Both tourists and business visitors from these countries may stay in Mexico for up to 180 days. For Russian, Turkish and Ukrainian passport holders, electronic authorization (SAE)

is required. This authorization grants travelers from these countries the right to a single entry, with stays ranging from 30 to 180 days.

Please consult an embassy or consulate in your home country for the latest information on visa requirements.

When traveling to Mexico, you will need to fill out a 'Forma Migratoria Múltiple' (FMM), which is essentially a visitor's permit for Mexico. All travelers are encouraged to do so online prior to traveling, and present the printed out document upon entering the country.

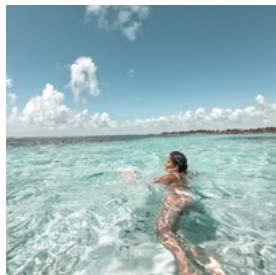

### Best Time to Visit



Costa Maya has a tropical climate, with hot and humid weather year-round. The peak tourist season runs from December to April, and it is also the warmest and driest period of the year.

The rainy season starts in June and lasts until around October, with the wettest months being September and October. During this period, you should take precautions against mosquito-transmitted diseases, as the increased humidity and standing water can lead to a higher mosquito population.

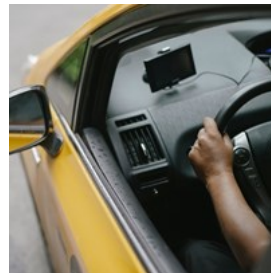
