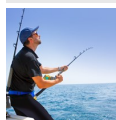

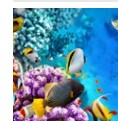

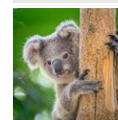

THE ISLAND

Hamilton Island is one of the 74 tropical islands in the Coral Sea, located between the Queensland coast and the Great Barrier Reef. It's the largest inhabited island in the Whitsundays, situated 1,222 kilometres north of Brisbane and 655 kilometres south of Cairns.

A picturesque, self-contained destination, Hamilton Island features a commercial marina, several resorts, restaurants, bars, takeaways, and sports facilities. It's also the only island in the Great Barrier Reef with its own airport, allowing direct flights from Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide, and Cairns. Alternatively, you can take a pleasant 30-minute boat ride from Shute Harbour or sail there in your own yacht and moor in the marina.

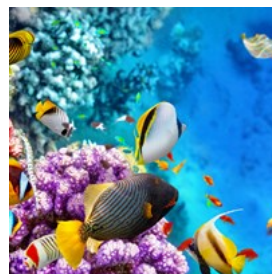

As home to many Australian animals and bird life, there will be plenty of fascinating flora and fauna to explore. Just make sure not to miss the most photographed beach in Australia, Whitehaven Beach, with its crystal clear water and pristine silica sand. Besides exploring the wonderful nature of Hamilton Island, there are plenty of activities to do such as golf, go karts and water sports.

Great Barrier Reef



A world heritage listed marine park, the Great Barrier Reef extends for 2,300 km along the North Eastern coast of Australia. It's the world's largest coral reef system, comprising a network of about 2,900 individual reefs and home to nearly 2,000 species of fish. Whether taking a scenic flight, cruising, diving, snorkelling or admiring this wonder through an underwater

viewing chamber, seeing it is one of the most magical experiences on the planet.

Passport / Visa



Unless you are a New Zealand citizen granted visa exemption on arrival (in most cases), you will need to obtain a visa prior to visiting Australia.

Citizens of all European Union countries, as well as Andorra, Norway, Iceland, San Marino, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, and Vatican City are eligible for an eVisitor visa, which can be applied for online.

For citizens of the United States, Canada, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Brunei, South Korea and Malaysia, the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) entry permit is available, which can be applied for online and grants holders the right to enter Australia an unlimited amount of times for stays of no longer than 3 months per visit.

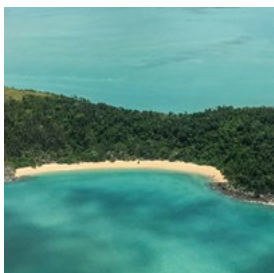

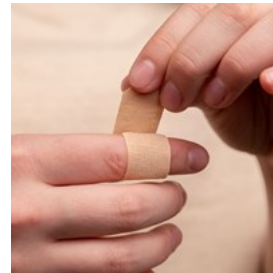

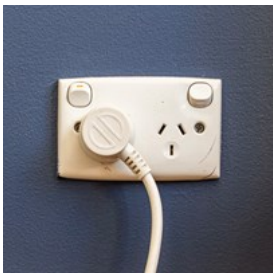
