THE CITY

Montgomery, Texas, proudly holds the title as the birthplace of the Lone Star Flag, a symbol Texans hold dear due to their strong sense of state pride and history.

The town's origins trace back to July 1837, when W.W. Shepperd established Montgomery within the Lake Creek Settlement. Soon after, Shepperd partnered with John Wyatt Moody, a former County Clerk of Montgomery County, Alabama, to officially name the town "Montgomery," in honor of Moody's previous home. By 1838, Montgomery had grown to become one of Texas' first counties, playing a crucial role in the state's early development.

The Lone Star Flag itself was born from this rich historical setting. In 1839, Dr. Charles B. Stewart, a local physician and statesman, was commissioned to design the official flag for the Republic of Texas. Stewart's iconic design—featuring a single white star—was adopted, and his original sketch remains on display at the N.H.Davis Pioneer Complex & Museum.

Montgomery's contribution to Texas heritage, through the birth of both the city and the Lone Star Flag, continues to be celebrated across the state today.

N.H.Davis Pioneer Complex & Museum



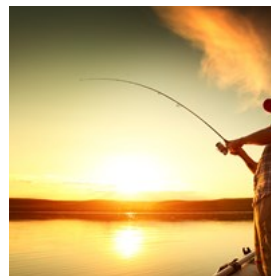
For those interested in Texas history while in Montgomery, be sure to visit the N.H.Davis Pioneer Complex & Museum which displays artifacts and memorabilia from the era when Texas was an independent republic.

The museum is housed in a historical structure originally owned by a lawyer, who built it in 1851 using logs received as payment for legal services. Visitors can explore period furnishings, a replica of the original Lone Star Flag sketch, and the Republic of Texas seal, both adopted in 1839. The complex also features informative plaques that detail the lives of Native settlements in the area.

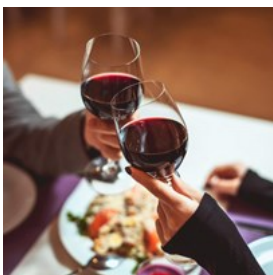

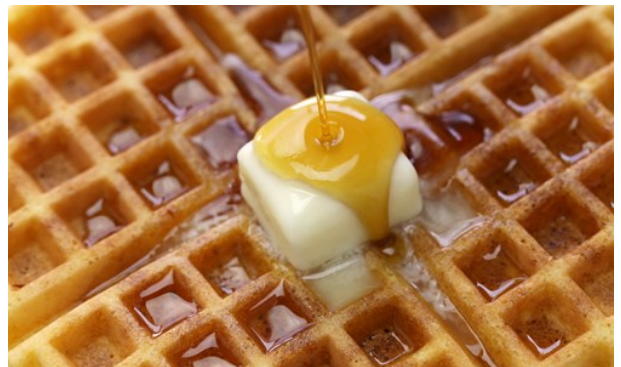

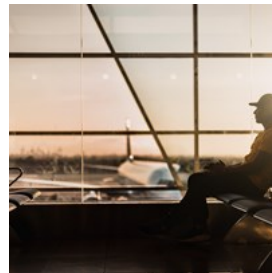

George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH)



For travelers flying to Montgomery, the best and most convenient airport is the George Bush Intercontinental Airport, located

approximately 63 kilometers (about 45 minutes by car) from the city. It's the primary airport serving the Houston area and offers a variety of domestic and international flights.

Passport/Visa



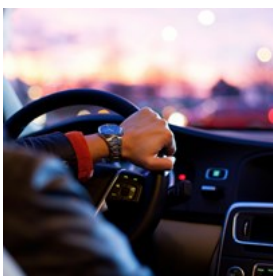
Citizens of Schengen Area countries, along with Andorra, Australia, Brunei, Canada, Ireland, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino,

Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom, can visit the United States for up to 90 days without needing a visa, provided they obtain an approved ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before their trip. All other travelers must secure a visa before visiting the U.S.

In addition, international travelers must ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. For the most current information and any updates on entry requirements, it is advisable to consult the U.S. Department of State website or contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate before traveling.
