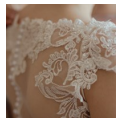

## THE CITY

While the Newcastle of today is a vibrant city with an upbeat lifestyle and an impressive cityscape, it used to be the biggest penal settlement outside Sydney. There was possibly not a more notorious place of punishment in the whole of Australia than Limeburners' Bay, located on the inner side of the Stockton peninsula, where convicts were sent to burn oyster shells.

Much has changed since the early 19th century, and Newcastle has become the second largest city in New South Wales. It is an elegant, attractive destination full of historic buildings and spectacular nature. Located at the mouth of the Hunter River, Newcastle is one of the busiest coal export ports in the world, but it is also known as the 'gateway to the Hunter Valley' wine region.

A visit to this region is a must. Your taste-buds will love local wine, chocolate and cheese. The city's beaches along the Tasman Sea offer plenty of surfing opportunities, ocean baths and adrenaline-filled activities, while the harbourside developments and the city centre are great for shopping, dining and clubbing in scenic surroundings.

### Newcastle Airport (NTL)



Newcastle Airport is only a 30-minute drive from the city centre. It offers various amenities, including short and long-term parking, several cafés and restaurants, and services for disabled passengers.

It's accessible by two bus companies. Port Stephens Coaches connect the airport to Newcastle train station and Nelson Bay, accepting credit cards and Opal cards for payment. Hunter Valley Buses, on the other hand, serve routes to Maitland, Raymond, and Stockton, accepting cash and Opal cards. Note that Opal cards can't be purchased at the airport.

As for taxis, they are available 24 hours a day at the taxi rank right outside the terminal. Uber and Didi are other good alternatives.

### Passport/Visa



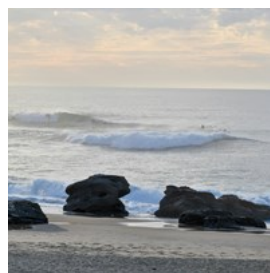
Unless you are a New Zealand citizen granted visa exemption on arrival, you will need to obtain a visa prior to visiting Australia. Citizens of all European Union countries, as well as Andorra, Norway, Iceland, San Marino, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, and Vatican City are eligible for an eVisitor visa, which can be applied for online. For citizens of the United States,

Canada, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Brunei, South Korea and Malaysia, the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) entry permit is available, which can be applied for online and grants holders the right to enter Australia an unlimited amount of times for stays of no longer than 3 months per visit.

Citizens of all other world countries are also able to apply for a visitor visa online. For more information, visit the official website of the Australian government's department of home affairs.

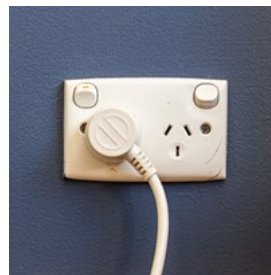
