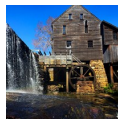

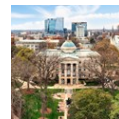

Raleigh is often called the "City of Oaks" for its abundance of trees and green spaces. It's also known as the "Smithsonian of the South" thanks to its impressive collection of free museums. With the Research Triangle Park nearby and numerous universities, including North Carolina State University, Raleigh is a hub of innovation and education.

The Greater Raleigh area encompasses eleven unique towns, each with its own distinct character. Apex, Cary, Garner, and Wake Forest charm visitors with their historic downtowns, tree-lined streets, and excellent golf courses. These neighboring towns offer opportunities for day trips, cozy bed-and-breakfast stays, and unique experiences, from traditional soda fountains to local wineries and even a scuba park.

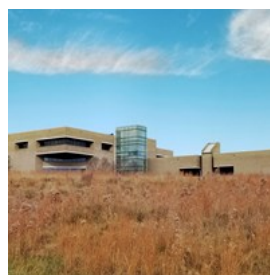

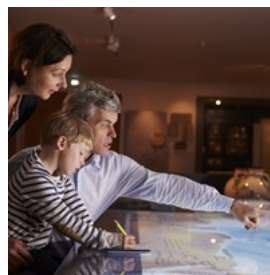

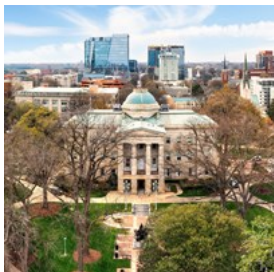
### North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences

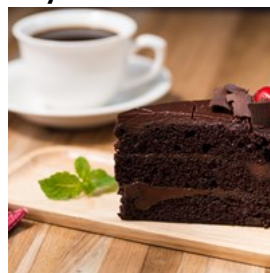

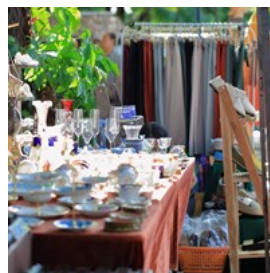

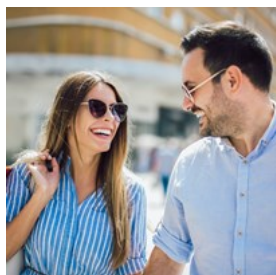

### Passport & Visa

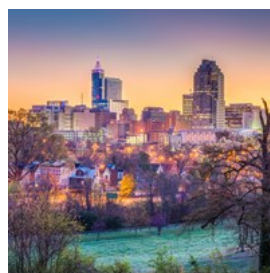


Citizens of the Schengen countries, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Japan, South Korea,

Taiwan and the Kingdom of Brunei can visit the United States for up to 90 days without applying for a visa (as well as citizens of Andorra, Lichtenstein, Monaco and San Marino). Citizens of these countries must obtain an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before traveling. All other travelers must obtain a visa before visiting the United States. International travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip to enter the country.

### Raleigh–Durham International Airport (RDU)



Raleigh–Durham (RDU), consistently ranked among the most efficient airports in North America, serves Raleigh and the Research

Triangle Region of North Carolina. RDU is located along the western edge of Wake County, nearest to Morrisville, The Research Triangle Park and Cary; it is midway between downtown Raleigh and downtown Durham.

RDU's two main terminals offer more than 400 daily arrivals and departures on eight major airlines. GoRaleigh, the primary public transportation provider in Raleigh, North Carolina, operates 27 fixed routes within the city and five

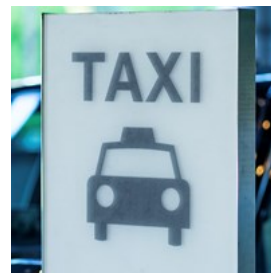
regional/express routes in partnership with GoTriangle.

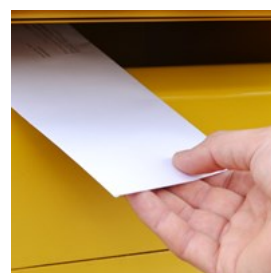
