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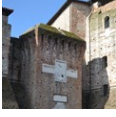
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THE CITY

Rimini, the capital city of the Province of Rimini, is located in the northern Emilia-Romagna region of Italy. This city is a captivating tapestry of contrasts, nestled between the Marecchia and Ausa rivers. In the city centre, ancient narrow streets and cosmopolitan squares, such as Piazza Cavour, Piazza Tre Martiri, and Corso d'Augusto, create a unique juxtaposition against the lively tourist zones and bustling beachfront areas. Here, vibrant bars and restaurants attract families and couples alike.

Rimini's diverse character is further highlighted by its districts, each possessing its own distinct charm. These neighbourhoods include Bellariva, Marebello, Marina Centro, Miramare, Rivabella, Rivazzurra, San Giuliano Mare, Torre Pedrera, and Viserba. Sanctuary of Our Lady of Mercy



This 14th-century church, known as Santuario della Madonna della Misericordia in Italian, is renowned for the portrait of Madonna della

Misericordia, painted by the artist Giuseppe Soleri in the 18th-19th century. Located near the Augustus Arch, this sanctuary was originally constructed by Clarisse nuns.

Throughout its history, this church has been a site of continuous pilgrimages and a place of profound prayer. It is said that the miraculous image of Madonna della Misericordia moved its eyes in 1850, adding to its mystique. As a result, the 12th of every month holds special significance as a day to commemorate this miraculous event.

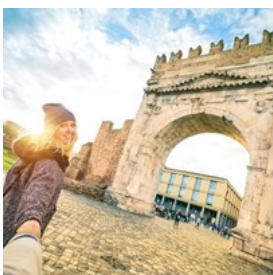

Arch of Augustus



Arch of Augustus is a landmark monument built in 27 BC in honour of Ceasar Augustus. This arch served to mark the end of the via Flaminia,

linking the cities of Romagna to Rome, and marked the beginning of the via Emilia, a road leading northwest to Piacenza. The Arch of Augustus is the oldest surviving Roman arch and has a single gate that is nearly 10 metres high.

Piazza Cavour



When exploring the historic city of Rimini, Piazza Cavour makes for an excellent starting point for your walk. This square, once a bustling

marketplace, has evolved into one of the city's vibrant social hubs. You'll find an array of bars and shops adorning its periphery.

Along one side of the square, you'll encounter some remarkable historical buildings, including Palazzo Garampi, Palazzo Arengo, and Palazzo Podestà. At the heart of it all stands the Fontana della Pigna, which, in its current form, serves as a testament to the enduring history of this place, as it dates back to Roman times.

Sismondo Castle

Tiberius Bridge



The Tiberius Bridge, known as Ponte Di Tiberio in Italian, is a significant architectural marvel. This ancient structure consists of five semicircular arches constructed from pristine white Istrian stone, elegantly spanning the Marecchia River. The bridge dates back to the 1st century AD and connects the city centre to Borgo San Giuliano. It is one of Rimini's most notable landmarks and officially a national monument.

Pigna Fountain



Located in piazza Cavour, the famous fountain La Fontana Della Pigna was built in 1543 by Giovanni da Carrara, although in part it dates back to the

Roman period. The fountain is of great significance as it served as the sole source of drinking water in the city until the public aqueduct was established in 1912. Additionally, there is an inscription on the fountain referring to Leonardo da Vinci's delight upon seeing this fountain.

The Aviation Museum, Museo Dell'Aviazione, is located outside Rimini and has around 40 planes, including a MiG-23, Phantom and Lockheed F-104. Church of San Giuliano Martire



San Giuliano Martire is a Renaissance-style Roman Catholic church that also serves as a museum. Construction of this remarkable structure

took place from 1553 to 1575, and it stands adjacent to an abbey that once belonged to the Benedictine order. Within the museum section of the church, you can explore an impressive collection of artworks, including renowned paintings by Paolo Veronese that depict the martyrdom of St. Julian and Bittino da Faenza, illustrating the life of the saint.

Tempio Malatestiano



Tempio Malatestiano, also called Duomo di Rimini, was completely refurbished by the Malatesta family during the XV century. Important

artists as Leon Battista Alberti, Matteo de' Pasti, Agostino di Duccio and Piero della Francesca worked on it. Today, besides being a place of worship, the Tempio houses also a museum of manuscripts and reliquaries from the XIV and XV century.

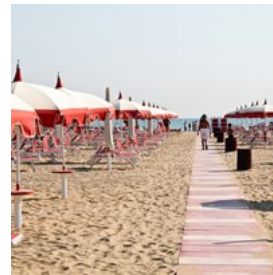


Italy can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. If you are not sure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend you to contact the embassy or consulate in your country. In order to enter the Schengen zone, international travellers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip. Citizens from

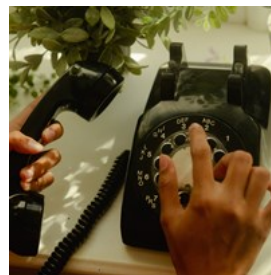
