Teide National Park



Teide National Park, a World Heritage Site with over three million visitors a year, is the best place to see volcanic phenomena in Tenerife.

You'll be astounded by the colours and the wild force of this surreal landscape, overlooked by Spain's highest peak at 3,718 metres. It is home to many local species of flora and fauna, such as the Teide violet or the Tenerife bugloss, whose bright colours stand in stark contrast to the thousands of tonnes of ochre running through this unique landscape.

The Ancient Dragon Tree



Estimated to be over 800 years old, the Ancient Dragon Tree of Icod de los Vinos presents a unique chance to see and touch such an incredibly

old living specimen of *Dracaena Drago*, which is known for being the protector of the islands. This colossal tree is 16 metres tall and it has a width of 20 metres.

Despite facing a threat due to the immense tourism it attracted, the Dragon Tree Park is currently open to visitors thanks to the efforts to conserve and restore the park's biodiversity. It is possible to visit the park on your own, or you can book a guided tour. If you decide to visit Tenerife, you can't miss this great treasure of the Canarian flora.

Embark on a dry canyoning adventure by venturing into the riverbeds of Vilaflor. Descend the canyon with professional guides via rappelling, and enjoy the picturesque hills, dense pine forests, and breathtaking vistas.

Los Carrizales is another opportunity to engage in thrilling activities like sliding, jumping, and rappelling down to discover natural waterfalls and serene pools. After a descent of 15 metres, you'll find a unique, natural water park.

Los Arcos canyons are a rock formation of warm

orange and green colours due to the erosion over the years. This dry canyon welcomes experienced canyon enthusiasts as well beginner ones, making ideal for families.

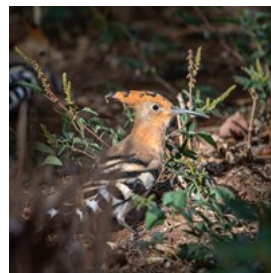

Bird Watching & Stargazing



With some of the clearest skies in the world, Tenerife is perfect for stargazing and bird watching. The Canary Islands and Tenerife are the first places you can see birds on their annual migration to Equatorial Africa.

As for stargazing, Tenerife's high altitude and

little pollution offer the best spots to see the cosmos. Some of the most popular ones are The Masca Viewpoint in Teno Rural Park, The Mountains of Guajara in Teide National Park and The Mirador de la Ruleta in La Orotava.

Birdwatching on the other hand, is something you can do anywhere in Tenerife, as the island is home to many species, some of which are completely endemic. The northwest region is its most remote area, where the infamous Bolle's Pigeon and the elusive White-tailed Laurel Pigeon live. Other regions for birdwatching are the northeast and the south of the island.

Water Activities



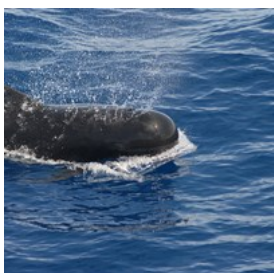
Deep-sea fishing, sailboat trips, windsurfing, kitesurfing, kayaking and diving are just some of the activities on offer in Tenerife. The

Dolphin & Whale Watching



Tenerife is a top destination for whale and dolphin watching. Take advantage of the fact that 21 of the world's 79

species of dolphins and whales inhabit the island's waters, including a

permanent colony of some 500 pilot whales and 250 bottlenose dolphins. Most of these extraordinary creatures predominantly inhabit the waters nestled between the island's southern coastline and the neighbouring La Gomera. What makes this experience truly exceptional is their proximity to the shoreline, oftentimes only three miles from the coast.

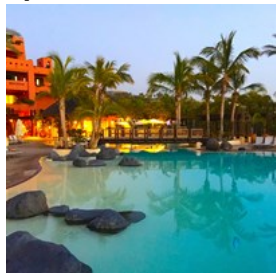

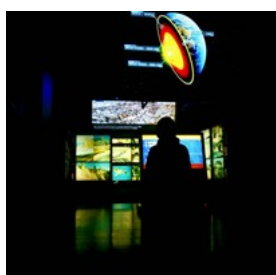

Pyramids of Güímar



Located in the southeastern part of Tenerife, these curious, rectangular pyramid-shaped structures are a curious

aspect of Tenerife's landscape. Archaeologists dispute why and when they were created. Most theories lean towards Aborigines and local farmers, although some believe these structures are the result of contact between the Tenerife natives and the Aztecs.

This archaeological park consists of six distinctive stepped pyramids of lava stone, standing at approximately four meters in height. The museum serves as both an educational journey and a tribute to the traditions and culture of ancient civilizations.

La Rambla de Castro



La Rambla de Castro is a 2-kilometre coastal path that goes through a nature preserve. Starting at sea level at the beach of Los Roques, this path takes in wonderful ocean views, craggy cliffs, and palm groves. Historic landmarks on the route include the Casona de Castro, Saint Peter's hermitage, and the 18th century San Bernardo's Fort. The walk is not strenuous and public transport is available at the end of the route.

Candelaria Basilica



Its white and beige tones provide stark contrast to the bronze Menceyes, which are statues of ancient pre-Spanish kings. These statues are standing alongside the basilica and the black volcanic sands of the beach at its feet. The religious value of this building is greatly enhanced by the treasure of incalculable spirituality housed within. The exquisite statue of the Virgin of Candelaria, Patroness of the Canary Islands, is highly revered by the islanders.

BEACHES

On the island there are around 70 kilometres of beaches where you can enjoy a variety of activities, including pedalos, jet skis and parasailing. Or you can just relax, let the sea breeze cool you down and have a quick dip whenever you fancy. Most beaches on Tenerife have been awarded the Blue Flag for the quality of the water, the services available and their easy access. Beaches with golden sand are mainly to be found in the south, from Güímar to Adeje. Las Vistas, Las Galletas, El Médano, Torviscas and Fañabé are some good examples.

Las Teresitas



Las Teresitas is the most famous beach around the metropolitan area of Santa Cruz, the Island's capital. At 1.5 kilometres in length, its golden sands are in close proximity to the small coastal town of San Andrés. The beach is also conveniently located near Anaga Rural Park. You can visit its lush green forests dotted with white houses first, then finish your day under a tropical palm tree on this iconic beach.

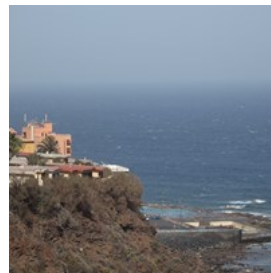
Black Sand Beaches

DINING

The local gastronomy is a further example of Tenerife's authenticity and certainly the most delicious. Dishes made from local produce create a marvellous fusion between traditional and avant-garde.

Tenerife's traditional cuisine revolves around the abundant resources of the sea, with an emphasis on fish and seafood. What is more, the island's culinary heritage is inspired by South American countries, such as Venezuela and the Caribbean. The island's gastronomy is characterized by its simplicity, prioritizing locally-sourced products like fish, potatoes, pork and cheeses.

Guachinches



There is a type of establishment on the Island known as a Guachinche. These small, family-run eateries, often improvised on the terrace or in the garage of rural houses, only open at certain times of the year to offer wine from their own harvest accompanied by two or three traditional dishes at very affordable prices. Such establishments have deep roots on the Island, and islanders will be delighted to tell visitors how to find them.

Tenerife Reina Sofía Airport (TFS)



Tenerife Reina Sofía Airport, commonly known as Tenerife South Airport, stands as the larger of the two airports on the island and is situated

approximately 90 kilometres away from the capital city of Santa Cruz.

There are three busses connecting the airport to the rest of the island:

- The 343 bus line runs non-stop between Tenerife Norte and Tenerife Sur Airports in just 50 minutes;
- Bus line 111 (night line 711) cruises between Santa Cruz, the airport, Los Cristianos and Costa Adeje;
- Bus line 415 connects El Fraile, the airport and San Isidro.

As the second busiest airport in the Canary Islands (after Gran Canaria, LPA), the Tenerife Reina Sofía Airport plays host to a multitude of major European airlines and destinations, including the likes of Air France, British Airways, Finnair, and Iberia, among others.

Tenerife Norte Airport (TFN)



Tenerife North Airport, previously known as Los Rodeos Airport, is one of the two international airports on the island of Tenerife. It is located in San Cristóbal de La Laguna, approximately 11 kilometres from Santa Cruz de Tenerife.

There are four bus lines connecting Tenerife North Airport to the rest of the island:

- Line 343 runs from Puerto de la Cruz, to Tenerife Norte Airport, to Tenerife Sur Airport and ends in the town of Los Cristianos. This bus line runs non-stop between the two airports in just 50 minutes;
- Line 20 connects Santa Cruz with La Laguna and Tenerife Norte Airport;
- Line 30 connects Puerto de la Cruz with Tenerife Norte Airport
- Line 104 shuttles passengers between Santa Cruz, Tenerife Norte Airport and Puerto de la Cruz.

Unlike Tenerife Reina Sofía, this airport is smaller and it serves more as a connection between all seven of the Canary Islands. However, it also offers flights to the Iberian Peninsula and to other countries in Europe. Currently, Tenerife North Airport is home to airlines such as Binter Canarias, CanaryFly, Vueling, Ryanair, and others.
