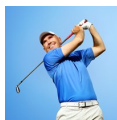

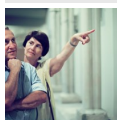

## THE CITY

In the heart of the Philippine archipelago, Cebu is at once the island, metropolitan area and provincial capital. The seat of Christianity in the Philippines since Ferdinand Magellan first planted a cross on the shoreline, the city has played host to a number of mixed foreign settlers who left a lasting impression on the landscape and culture.

Spain in particular had a strong colonial presence and left a Catholic legacy. As a centre for trade, commerce, arts and education, the city is a mishmash of the old and new, and offers a real flavour of Philippine life in all its guises. The lust for life is apparent 24 hours a day, the common usage of English makes everything quite simple and the welcoming smiles of the locals seem to greet you wherever you go.

Since Cebu was the first Spanish settlement in the Philippines, the city offers many historical attractions for visitors. The large seaport and air hub have also contributed to the modernisation of the city, blending urban culture with historical heritage.

### Magellan's Cross



Housed in a kiosk, this iconic and much prized monument marks the spot where the explorer Ferdinand Magellan planted a cross after baptising the first Filipinos, so creating Cebu as the cradle of Christianity in the Philippines. Look skywards to admire the ceiling paintings depicting the historical event.

### Fort San Pedro

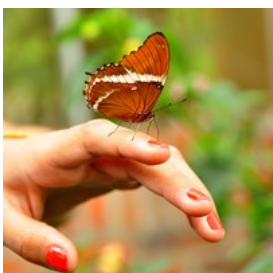

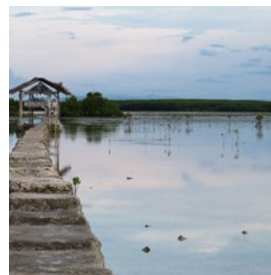

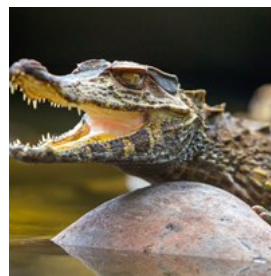
Twice a year during winter and spring, on one of the most important migratory flyways in the world, tens of thousands of birds touch down on this small island to rest their weary bodies.

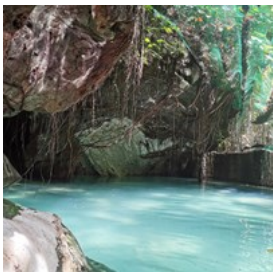
### Cebu Taoist Temple

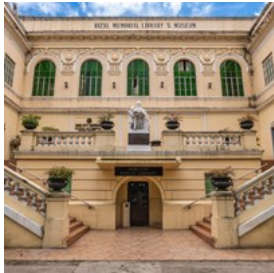
### Colon Street

### Osmeña Peak



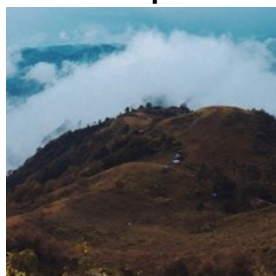
Osmeña Peak is the highest point on the island of Cebu, standing at 1,013 metres above sea level. The hike to the peak takes about 20-30 minutes, making it suitable for beginners while still offering breathtaking views of the surrounding landscape, including rugged hills and the sea.

The trek to Osmeña Peak can start from various points, such as Badian, which is close to Kawasan Falls, or from Mantalongon. These starting points offer different scenic routes and experiences. Along the trail, you might encounter small shops selling snacks or chai, adding to the charm of the journey.

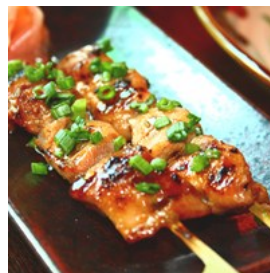

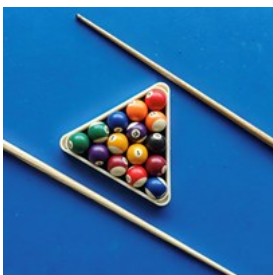

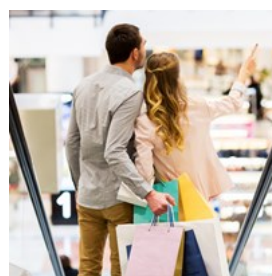

### Mactan-Cebu International Airport (CEB)



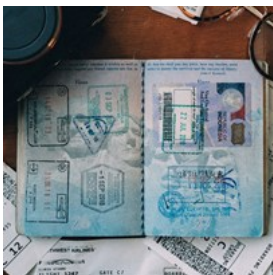
Mactan-Cebu International Airport (CEB) is located on Mactan Island, 9 kilometres from the centre of Cebu City.

### Passport/Visa



The Philippines can be visited visa-free for up to 30 days by citizens of all European Union member states, all ASEAN member states, the UK, the USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, South Africa, Malaysia, Israel, the UAE and most countries in Latin America. A

valid return or onward ticket and a passport that is valid upon entry and for at least six months beyond the period of stay are required to enter the Philippines. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, contact the embassy or consulate in your country.

### Public Transport



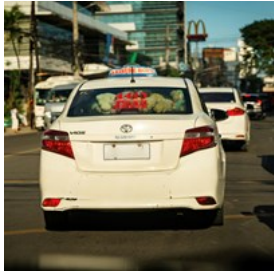

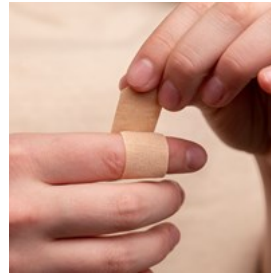

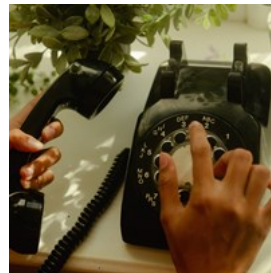
