Set in the mist-shrouded mountains 80 km west of Mackay, Eungella is Australia's longest continual stretch of sub-tropical rainforest. It

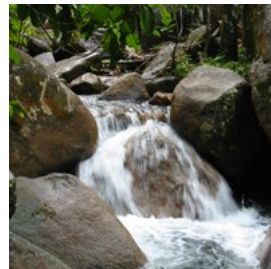
